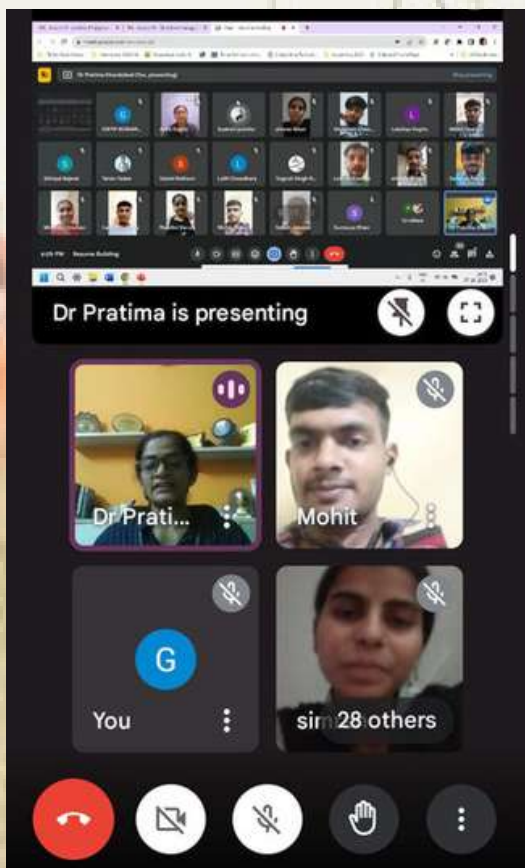
Self Defense Training

Advise Patients On Five Tips When Consuming Vitamins, Supplements, Energy Drinks

As pharmacists, the new year is a terrific time to remind our patients of potential drug interactions they may encounter as they refocus their health care journeys and incorporate vitamins, supplements, protein powders, and likely more caffeine into their daily routines. It's also a great time to highlight cost-savings opportunities by eliminating duplicative ingredients.

As a pharmacist, here are 5 tips I share with my patients this time of year as they set health goals:

Be mindful of your prescription medications. There are several OTC supplements that are known to interact with prescription medications. For example, the herbal supplement St. John's wort, which is commonly used to increase serotonin, can reduce the effectiveness of birth control, as well as medications for heart disease and depression, among others. Even OTC pain medications such as ibuprofen may cause more harm than good if you have gastrointestinal issues. It's important for patients to review their complete list of medications (both OTC and prescription) with a pharmacist annually to avoid harmful interactions.

Review ingredients before purchasing or consuming products. Smoothies and tonics you pick up at the gym after your workout often contain multiple supplements—collagen, protein, vitamins B and C, etc. Be mindful of how much you are consuming of each throughout the day. Too much of any one item can lead to unintended consequences, such as gastrointestinal issues.

Be aware of caffeine consumption. Energy drinks often contain high levels of caffeine. For reference, an 8 oz cup of coffee contains up to 100 mg of caffeine, while 8 ounces of an energy drink may contain up to 250 milligrams of caffeine, according to the FDA.⁵ The FDA says for healthy adults, you should cap your caffeine intake at 400 milligrams a day. Too much caffeine can reduce your ability to properly absorb your medications.

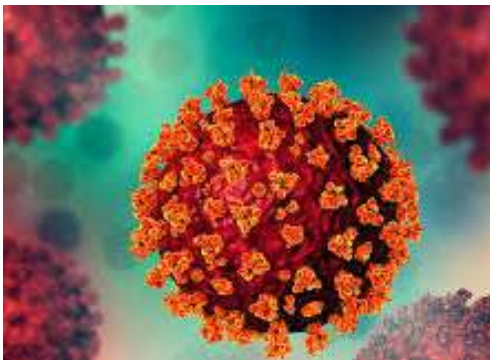
Identify protein needs. Protein is essential in our diets, but too much protein is linked to constipation, diarrhea, and bad breath. The Mayo Clinic recommends that those who exercise regularly need about 1.5 grams per kilogram of body weight.

Set a budget. To increase safety and reduce costs, consider eliminating items that are repetitive. For example, if you're getting caffeine in your coffee, maybe eliminate your energy drink. If you're getting vitamin B in your daily multi-vitamin, think about eliminating it from your smoothie.

By offering personalized guidance, promoting awareness, and fostering open communication, pharmacists can empower their patients to navigate the new year with a focus on both wellness and safety.

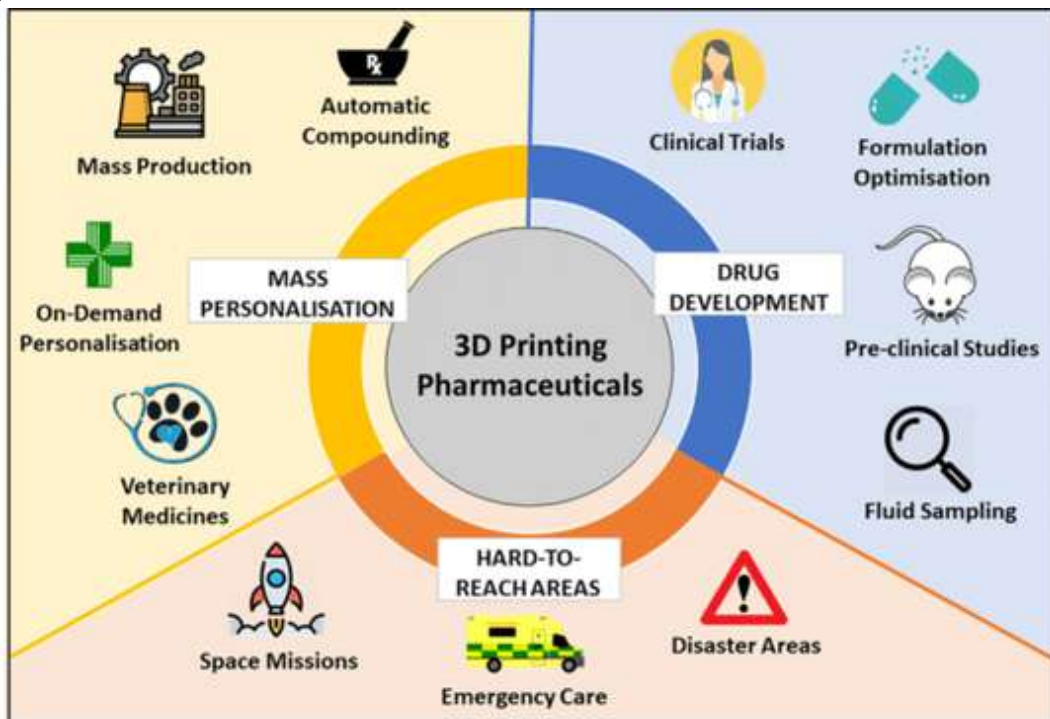

The 3D printing has become one of the most revolutionary and powerful tool serving as a technology of precise manufacturing of individually developed dosage forms, tissue engineering and disease modeling. The term three-dimensional printing was defined by International Standard Organization (ISO) as: “fabrication of objects through the deposition of a material using a print head, nozzle, or another printer technology”. 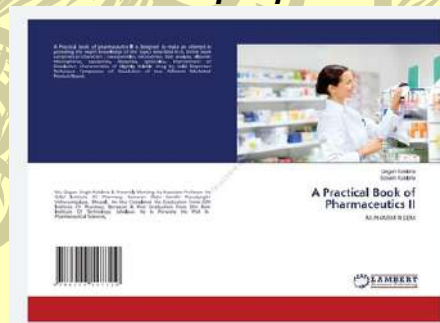

India bans 14 fixed-dose medicines for likely posing risks to health

The Indian government has banned 14 types of fixed-dose combination (FDC) medicines due to a lack of therapeutic justification and potential risks to humans, according to an expert panel's recommendations. FDCs mix two or more active ingredients in a fixed ratio. The FDCs that have been banned include Nimesulide+ Paracetamol dispersible tablets and Pholcodine+ Promethazine, amongst others. The decision has been taken after an earlier restriction of 344 FDCs was challenged by manufacturers in court.

The following are the list of the 14 banned FDCs

1. Nimesulide, paracetamol dispersible tablet
2. Amoxicillin, bromhexine
3. Pholcodine, promethazine
4. Chlorpheniramine maleate, dextromethorphan, guaiphenesin, ammonium chloride, menthol.
5. Ammonium chloride, bromhexine, dextromethorphan
6. Chlorpheniramine maleate, codeine syrup
7. Bromhexine, dextromethorphan, ammonium chloride, menthol
8. Dextromethorphan, chlorpheniramine, guaiphenesin, ammonium chloride
9. Paracetamol, bromhexine, phenylephrine, chlorpheniramine, guaiphenesin
10. Salbutamol, bromhexine
11. Chlorpheniramine, codeine phosphate, menthol syrup
12. Phenytoin, phenobarbitone sodium
13. Ammonium chloride, sodium citrate, chlorphenirami...
13. Ammonium chloride, sodium citrate, chlorpheniramine maleate, menthol
14. Salbutamol, hydroxyethyl theophylline, bromhexine
